9. **SUMMARY**:

The apostle Peter while a disciple of Jesus had been given the initial revelation of the <u>sufferings</u> of Christ and the <u>glory</u> that should follow in the church. It is upon this experience that the themes of his epistles are built. The theme of this first epistle is glory through suffering. In the first section suffering is seen in relation to salvation, emphasizing the living hope, the living word, the living stone and our reaction to the same. The second section deals with suffering in relation to conduct, covering every area of life and setting forth Christ as the example. The final section concerns suffering in relation to attitudes in both shepherds and sheep. It should be noted that in every context where "suffering" appears "glory" is also to be found.

Note: One good approach to studying the epistles of Peter is to relate his writings to his own life as revealed in the Gospels and Acts.

10. CHRIST SEEN:

Christ is seen as the <u>Foreordained Lamb</u>, the <u>Chief-Cornerstone</u>, the <u>Stone of Stumbling</u>, the <u>Rock of Offence</u>, the <u>Example</u>, the <u>Chief Shepherd</u>, and the <u>Bishop</u> of our Souls, who experienced the sufferings of the Cross and was crowned with Glory and Honour.
